

## Aqueduct at a Glance:

The **Aqueduct Rowing Club** was founded in 1973 to promote the sport of rowing on the Mohawk River. Since its establishment, the Club has served as an incubator for a number of successful high school and college rowing programs. The Club is located at the corner of Aqueduct and Balltown Roads near the Rexford Bridge. Aqueduct occupies two bays of a three-bay boathouse that is shared with Niskayuna high school. Launching docks are available on the Mohawk River immediately in front of the Club.



The Club maintains a number of rowing and sculling boats including 3 eights, 4 fours, two doubles and three singles which are available for use by Club members. Coached rowing programs for crew boats are held throughout the summer and fall beginning at 5:30 P.M. for both novice and experienced rowers. Coached sculling clinics are also held on selected weekends for interested scullers.

In addition to the coached programs, Club crew boats may be rowed at any other times that a sufficient number of members are available. Likewise scullers may take out Club sculls whenever their schedule permits. For safety reasons, scullers using Club boats must demonstrate the ability to capsize and re-enter a shell without assistance.



Membership in the Club is open to adults over the age of 18. Single membership is \$300 and family membership is \$450. Each member is entitled to store a single rowing shell and oars in the boathouse as space permits.

Members are encouraged to participate in Club activities including maintenance work ('dock in' and 'dock out'), social functions (dinners and barbecues), and the annual fall regatta (Head-of-the-Mohawk) that is the Club's primary fund-raising activity.

The scenic Mohawk River is one of the finest rowing sites available in the area and currently is the home of a number of high school and college rowing clubs. We hope you will decide to row with Aqueduct.
